Our Mission

Little Blooms Montessori Preschool's mission is to provide the environment, materials, and nurturing to allow the child to blossom, to develop a lifelong love of learning, a discovery of self, and a proclivity for peace and harmony.

Objectives

1. Create a space where students can learn and build community by interacting with the world and those around them in a responsible, safe, and open way.
2. Give parents the comfort of knowing their child is in a nurturing environment that feels like home, where their unique personality and intelligence are respected, and their physical, emotional, social, spiritual, and mental growth is supported.

What To Expect

The Program

Little Blooms is a Montessori Early Childhood Education Spanish dual-immersion program for children ages 3 to 6 years old. All instruction is overseen by a MAC-TE (Montessori Accreditation Council for Teacher Education) certified Montessori instructor.

Activities include:

- Age and development level appropriate activities | Stories | Songs
- Cultural studies | Art | Cooking | Reading | Games | Music
- Physical Exercise | Outdoor Play | Yoga | Positive Self-esteem Affirmations for Kids | Field trips

The curriculum is inspired by the world-renowned Montessori method of education, a method of instruction that has been proven successful over the past century. Our education emphasizes fun, respect, good manners, arts, music, physical exercise, and good food. Little Blooms follows the Montessori Research & Development curriculum for Early Childhood.

Curriculum areas include English Language Arts, beginning Spanish conversation, Math, Zoology, Botany, Practical Life, Sensorial, Art, Geography, and Cultural Studies.

Young children benefit from having structure and routines in their daily schedules. These routines help them notice changes in their surroundings and within themselves, explore and choose the right responses, reflect on their experiences, and, as they grow older, plan for the future. Structure and routines also build a sense of trust and allow their minds to focus on adapting to change.

Little Blooms Montessori Preschool is for children ages 3 to 6 years old. Children should be working diligently toward toilet training by the day of entry. We are happy to assist you in these efforts. Children must be ready for the type of group experiences offered and able to benefit from the program.

Healthy Preschoolers



Preschool students should only attend school if healthy. Any signs of cough, cold, runny nose, flu, fever, vomiting/diarrhea, stomach upset, eye discharge or pink eye, nasal discharge, loss of sense of taste or smell, body aches, etc. are indicators that students should remain at home. If a child has any of these symptoms when they arrive, they will be asked to return home. Parents will be called to pick up students who exhibit any of these symptoms while at school. A student should be free of any symptoms for a minimum of 24 hours after being ill before returning to school. Please be mindful if you are carpooling. Parents, if you suspect a child might be ill, we encourage you to take your child's temperature prior to placing him or her in a car to avoid exposing other classmates in the carpool to illness. Our goal is to stay healthy. We must be vigilant. Thank you for your cooperation in this important matter.



Hand sanitizing

Everyone entering Little Blooms will wash their hands at the sink in the entry.



Building Cleaning Procedures

All learning areas will be frequently disinfected including door handles, railings, and bathrooms daily.



Student Sanitary Measures

Students will wash hands prior to eating snack, lunch, and after being outside and after using the toilet.



Masks

Masks are not required. However, if you feel more comfortable sending your child wearing a mask, you are encouraged to do so.

Admission requirements

- Personal interview and tour
- Signed School Readiness Guidelines
- Signed tuition agreement
- Each child is required to have completed an Admission Agreement and Health Assessment form
- Each child must submit an immunization certificate completed by certified medical practitioner or physician's assistant
- Each child must be potty trained or working diligently toward that goal
- Each child must be at least three years old

Attendance & Written messages

- A record of your child's attendance, tardiness and absenteeism will be maintained. Inconsistency interrupts your child's progress at school.
- Please contact the school via Little Blooms' Absence Form in the app if your child will be late or not attending school on any particular day.
- Important messages should be clearly written to ensure prompt and accurate communication.

Birthday celebrations

We celebrate your child's birthday with a simple classroom tradition. Parents and grandparents are invited to join in. The tradition includes sharing a picture or special item from each year of the child's life. Parents or guardians are encouraged to prepare a brief story about their child's life. As the story is shared, the birthday boy or girl will take part in the traditional birthday walk. No party supplies are needed, and the celebration times are flexible.

Change of information

It is imperative that we have current information on file for all students. Please notify the school with any changes to pertinent information (including, but not limited to): addresses, phone numbers, emergency contacts, transportation contacts, medical information, etc.

Child abuse

Staff members of this school are Mandatory Reporters and are required by law, under Utah Code § 62A-4a-403, to report any known or suspected child abuse or neglect to the county Department of Human Services or to the local police or county sheriff.

Child discipline

- Establishing discipline is primarily the responsibility of parents.
- Parents are responsible for setting rules and creating safe boundaries for their children.
- Parents are responsible for teaching their children grace and courtesy.
- Parents are responsible for monitoring their child's growth and applying clear rules that foster self-discipline, independence, and mutual respect.
- At Little Blooms Montessori Preschool, the Positive Discipline approach is practiced. Children are given appropriate language and shown appropriate behaviors to express their feelings in response to new or challenging situations. If a child has difficulty respecting another's personal space, they may be asked to walk with the educator around the learning environment, as the educator directly models respectful interaction. This practice helps the child develop independence in the learning environment.
- A child's misconduct will be documented and communicated to the parents. If a child does not respond to the educator's kind but firm guidance, and remains unresponsive to various positive discipline methods, alternative childcare options may be recommended.
- No child will be subjected to discipline that is severe, humiliating, or frightening. Discipline will not be linked to food, rest, or toileting. Spanking or any other form of physical punishment is strictly prohibited.
- After suggestions, interventions, and education, if further disregard for school policy is observed, the child may need to transition to a different childcare setting.

Clothing

Children should dress comfortably and be prepared for indoor and outdoor activities. Children will play outside as a group in all kinds of weather. Please be sure your child is dressed accordingly. We would also appreciate it if the clothing does not feature any violence or profanity. Please send children in clothes they can paint with, play outside with, etc. Provide them with simple and comfortable shoes; slip-on or Velcro shoes are best so they can build their independence in dressing themselves. Please dress for the weather; bring snow gear if the day is snowy, comfortable clothing on warm days, etc.

Clothing (cont.)

Please provide a spare set of clothes (shirt, pants, socks, and underwear) in a Ziploc bag, labeled with your child's name, that we can keep at the school throughout the year for unforeseen situations. Please provide a pair of slippers that will be left at the school for your children to wear indoors. Please let us know if financial hardship makes it difficult for you to do this, and slippers will be provided.

Communication

If your child will be absent from school, please inform the school via the Little Blooms' app Absent Form. Please note that there will be no reduction in tuition for days missed. Fridays are reserved as make-up days until children are caught up with the curriculum they have missed.

To keep parents well informed, we use the Little Blooms' app for easy communication with our school families. In addition, Little Blooms' faculty and staff will be happy to answer questions if they are present at drop-off or pick-up. Please email the school administrator if you wish to seek an appointment time.

Confidentiality

- Children's records and information about them and their families will be kept confidential.
- Confidential information about children and their families will only be used or shared for purposes directly related to the child's well-being.
- Any discussions regarding children and their families will be treated with confidentiality.
- Confidential information, including children's records, will only be accessible to authorized individuals.
- The Department of Child Care Licensing has the right to review the center's records, including children's records.

Emergency contacts

You are required to maintain at all times, at least one additional emergency contact other than the parent(s)/guardians(s), including full names and contact phone numbers. Please be aware that in the event of an emergency for which parent(s)/guardians(s) or an emergency contact cannot be reached, Little Blooms staff or faculty may contact police or other emergency authorities.

Expectations

01 Commitment & communication

Guiding a young child's development requires a strong commitment to communication between the teacher, parents, and child. Your child's success in Montessori education depends on this collaboration and on your willingness to apply Montessori principles at home. Resources will be offered to deepen your understanding of how children learn, the importance of practical life and sensory activities, the methods used to teach reading and math, why children behave as they do, and much more.

02 Freedom within limits

A common misconception about Montessori education is that children are allowed to do whatever they want. Dr. Maria Montessori clarified, "The child is allowed freedom within limits." This means that a child can choose their activities and perform them in a way that develops their skills, but not at the expense of another child's freedom or the well-being of the group. The Montessori philosophy places great emphasis on respect for others, oneself, and the environment.

03 Participation

Parents enhance the curriculum of Little Blooms Montessori Preschool by sharing their talents, cultural traditions, ethnic backgrounds, unique skills, travel experiences, expertise, and time. The experience at Little Blooms Montessori Preschool has always been greatly enriched by the connections that parents, along with their friends and families, bring to our community of young learners.



Field trips and Off-campus activities

- Children will be secured in child restraints while being transported.
- Parents must sign a waiver releasing Little Blooms Montessori Preschool from liability for transporting their child to and from school and school-related events.
- Parents or guardians of 3-year-old children are strongly encouraged to accompany their child to off-campus activities.
- Individuals showing signs of being under the influence of drugs or alcohol will NOT be permitted to transport any child from campus or to and from off-campus activities and field trips.
- Smoking is prohibited in any vehicle used for transporting children.

Illness or Injury

- Parents will be notified if their child is sick. Symptoms of illness may include fever, persistent coughing, nausea, or swollen eyes that are pink, itchy, or have colored discharge. A sick child will be placed in a designated area until a parent or guardian arrives.
- An accident or injury report will be provided to the parents of children who cause injury to another child and are injured by another child.
- Any signs of a communicable disease will be reported to parents or guardians immediately.
- A child should be free from fever, diarrhea, or vomiting for at least 24 hours before returning to regular classes. Sending a child to school while still symptomatic can lead to unnecessary absences for other children and teachers.

Medications

Prescription medication must be distributed by the parent or guardian and must be in its original container. The label should include the physician's name, the child's name, the medication name, and the directions for use.

Parking and traffic

We are located in a residential neighborhood, and we count on your courteous driving. Reckless disregard to the safety of children, property, or other people in the vicinity will not be tolerated. Please park legally always, against the curb, facing the flow of traffic. (Continued on next page)

Parking and traffic (cont.)

Even though our street, Chapada, has little traffic and may seem empty, please never assume you don't have to park properly. Please do not idle your car. Please do not stop your car in the middle of the street, not for even a second and even if you are in the car, as this can disrupt traffic. Please do not pull your car to the curb against the flow of traffic, and never block this or any other driveway. The Pick-up and Drop-off area is the far left side (the extra paved space) of the main driveway or the curb directly in front of the house. If you have an unexpected circumstance one day, and the Pick-up and Drop-off area is in use, please find a legal parking stall and walk. Under no circumstance stop your car in the way of traffic, or park anywhere illegally. Failure to do your part to keep fluidity of transit and avoid congestion will result in warnings, a fine, probation, and may be cause for dismissal. We appreciate the thoughtful community of parents we have, who, for the most part, are conscientious, courteous drivers and arrive on time.

Progress reports

- Parent-teacher conferences will be held twice per school year.
- Daily progress will be tracked with Transparent Classroom and can be accessed by parents at any time.

Quiet time

- Preschool-aged children are given the opportunity to nap for at least 45 minutes, but no longer than 2 hours. Children who do not nap will have the option to rest and enjoy quiet time.
- Parents should provide a clean bedroll each week for their children. Each child's bedroll will be sent home at the end of the week to be washed and returned to school for use the following week.

Registration and fees

Applications for enrollment in Little Blooms are accepted beginning January 20, 2026. Confirmation for new students will be processed and emailed post-haste. To apply, complete the online application and required forms in Transparent Classroom and submit them along with the non-refundable \$175 application and materials fee in the Little Blooms' OneSpot app, which uses Stripe for billing. *Once enrollment reaches capacity, your child will be placed on a waiting list, and you will be contacted when space becomes available.

Children need to arrive on time. Children arriving late should be escorted into the classroom by an adult. There is no morning care or afternoon care before and after these times.

Late Pick-Up Fee

It is important that students are picked up on time. A late pick-up fee of \$2/minute/child will be charged after designated pick-up times. On-going late pick-ups could result in the student's dismissal from the program.

Release of Children

Your child will only be released to a parent/legal guardian or to those people you have listed as an Emergency contact and/or Approved Pick-up. If someone other than those noted above will be picking up your child, you are required to notify the Preschool staff by calling or texting or via the Little Blooms' OneSpot app. The designated person will be required to show picture ID.

Snacks and lunch

If your child has special dietary requirements or allergies, please alert the staff.

Preschool classes will be provided with healthy morning and afternoon snacks. Parents need to pack a healthy lunch for their child. Participants should eat well before school and bring a healthy lunch each day in a lunch container AND a water bottle, both clearly labeled with your child's name. Please help your child avoid processed foods containing sugar, colorings, and other additives, especially Lunchables, Go-gurts, and fruit snacks. Foods not allowed: desserts, cookies, candy, fruit snacks, and gum. We strongly encourage you to send your student with healthy foods and to avoid processed foods.

Student photos and videos

Unless the school receives written notification opting out, students may be photographed and/or video-taped during school and school-related events. These images and videos may be used on the school's website, Instagram, in parent handbooks, and for limited public relations purposes.

Supplies

Supplies and activities (excluding school field trip admission fees) are included in the school tuition and materials fee.

Tuition

Full Payment

Tuition paid in full for the entire school year on or before September 1, 2026 will receive a 5% discount.

Monthly Installment Plan Options

We understand the importance of making educational opportunities affordable for families in today's economy. Our monthly payment plans break your tuition into smaller, more manageable installments.

Tuition (cont.)

Installment payments are due on the first of each month. You are encouraged to sign-up for our convenient automatic payment program through Stripe. The monthly installment payment will be automatically charged to the credit or debit card that you authorize during set-up. Automatic debits/credits will help you avoid paying fines for delinquent tuition. After the fifth of each month, if tuition is delinquent, a \$10 late fee plus \$50 for every 7-day period will be applied to tuition until paid in full.

Tuition Payment Policy & Agreement

Tuition includes supplies and activities fees. The Tuition Payment & Plan is in effect for the entire 2026-2027 School Year as noted above. If a withdrawal from Little Blooms Montessori Preschool becomes necessary the Tuition Payment & Plan remains in effect and will be required to be paid once initial payment has been made by September 1, 2026.

Parent(s)/Guardians(s) are contractually obligated to pay the tuition payment based on their child's enrollment regardless of the child's continued participation in the program. This is only if there are no students on the waitlist to take your student's place.

Withdrawal

If a withdrawal becomes necessary, a 90-day written notice by a parent/guardian is required. However, there will be no refund of tuition. Any exception to this policy is at the sole discretion of the Little Blooms' Director. If you have special circumstances and wish to request a waiver of this policy, please submit a full explanation in writing.
